- (1) What was the total value of provincially-owned vehicles that were written off in accidents by provincial officials during the (i) 2019/20, (ii) 2020/21 and (iii) 2021/22 financial years as at the latest specified date for which information is available;

- (i) 2019/20 – R10 057 210.30
- (ii) 2020/21 – R5 281 981.42
- (iii) 2021/22 – R10 778 995.00
- (2) what was the total amount spent on repairing accident damaged provincially-owned vehicles for the aforementioned financial years as at the latest specified date for which information is available;

**RESPONSE**

- (i) 2019/20 – R18 521 116.41
- (ii) 2020/21 – R10 273 294.00
- (iii) 2021/22 – R10 254 655.61

- (3) what was the total value in damages recovered from provincial officials that were involved in accidents whilst driving provincially-owned vehicles;

## RESPONSE

The Department of Transport through the Government Fleet Management Services does not charge officials but charges the departments for incidents that were caused by either negligence or where officials lost state cover because of unauthorized trips. Below are the amounts charged to the various departments:

- (i) 2019/20 – R491 466.73
- (ii) 2020/21 – R1 958 813.86
- (iii) 2021/22 – R783 511.07

- (4) whether any provincial officials were found to be either (a) negligent or (b) not authorized to make use of the provincially-owned vehicle at the time of the accident for the financial years specified above as at the latest specified date for which information is available; if so, can she kindly provide the relevant details in this regard?
